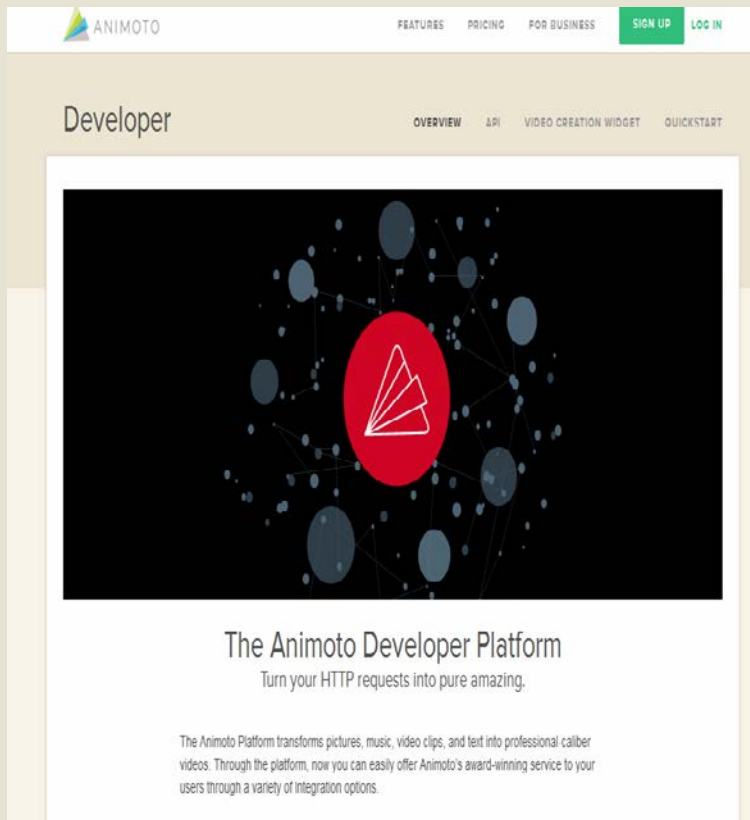

Animoto is used by businesses, educators, photographers, students, and digital natives



- ❑ You add the images, text, and music

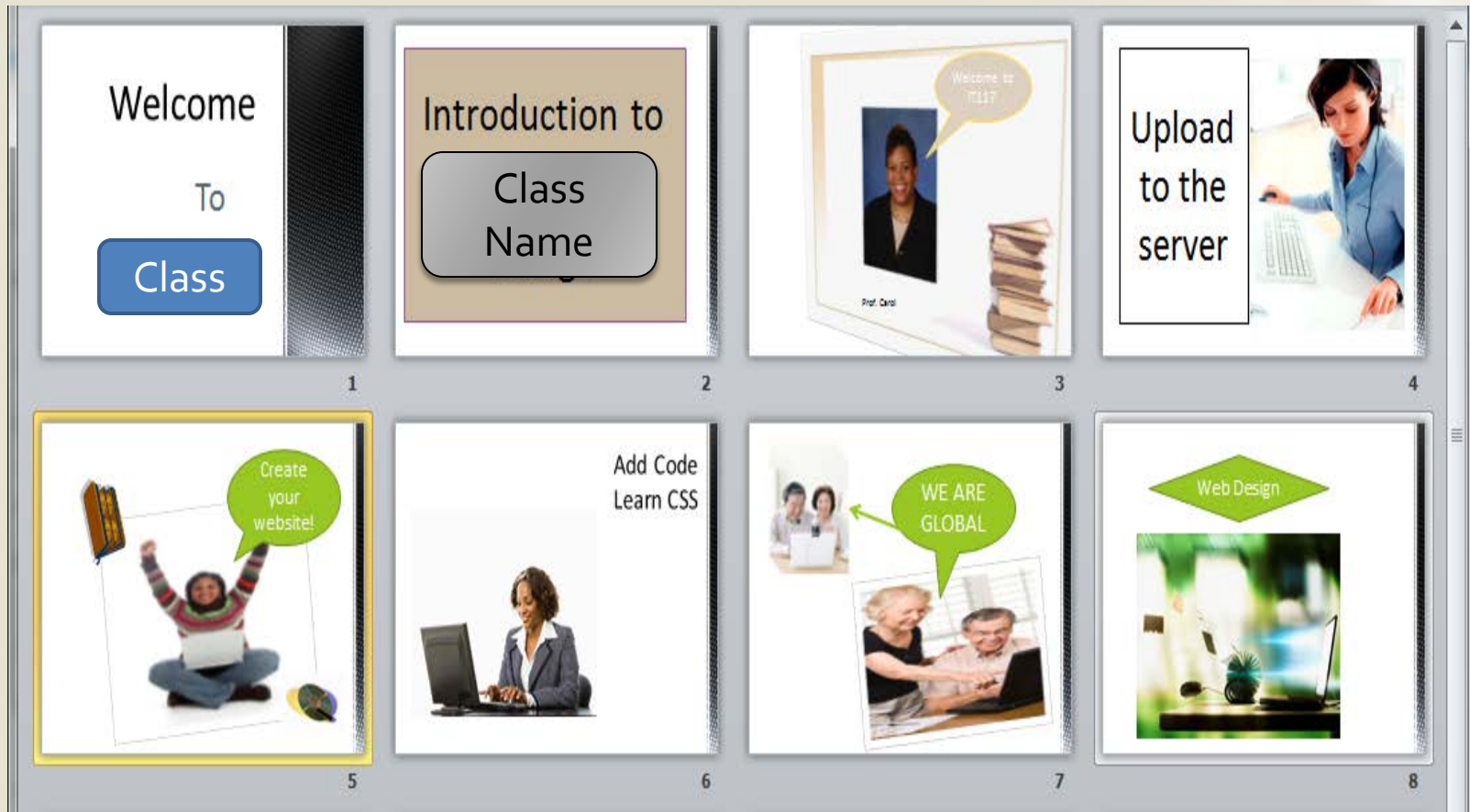
